Carolina for 33 years before retiring in May, 2013. Previously he served congregations in Atlanta, GA; Tallahassee, FL; and Louisville, KY. Joe is active in the Durham community having served on numerous boards and having been involved in many organizations. Joe is a graduate of Columbia Theological Seminary, formerly served on the Board of Trustees and was chair of the committee that called Laura Mendenhall as the 8th president of CTS. He received the Distinguished Service

Award from CTS in 2008.



He was introduced into the Order of the Long Leaf Pine by the Governor of North Carolina in 2013. After Dr. Massie's retirement, Joe served as Interim Pastor of First (Scots).

Joe and his wife Carlisle celebrated their 50th anniversary in August 2014. She directed the International Program at Duke University for 21 years. They have two children and three granddaughters.
