Exciting News!

Did you know that our last major renovation to the organ was completed in 1992? In late 2022 the Session created an Organ Commission to review the current state of the sanctuary organ and to make recommendations for repairs and renovations as deemed necessary. For nearly a year, the commission conducted a rigorous and comprehensive review of issues identified by vendors to determine what was necessary for reliability and tonal integrity. The commission and Session ultimately determined that an organ rehabilitation project with the replacement of some components is needed by 2025. This work will ensure the reliability of the organ in anticipation of our church family's 300-year celebration in 2031 and beyond. Thank you to Bob Dawson for chairing the commission and for the members of the commission which included Bob George, Don McDaniel, Karen Prewitt, John Robinson, Tom Slabaugh, and Darlene Daehler-Wilking. Dan Sansone and Holton Siegling served as ex-officio members of the commission.

The First (Scots) Memorial Garden is available as a place of inurnment for the ashes of members of First (Scots) and their immediate family members, as well as former members, ministers and former ministers, and their immediate family members.
