Report from the First Scots Organ Commission

Our pipe organ, central to worship and the sanctuary's history, consists of a keyboard console, electrical control systems, and an organ chamber with pipes and mechanisms. Despite its excellent tonal quality, our organ has numerous mechanical issues like unreliable stops and wiring problems, leading to operational challenges. To preserve its historic value, a total replacement was dismissed in favor of refurbishment. The organ commission selected R.A. Colby Company for this task, which includes updating components and digital enhancements, expected to extend the organ's life by more than 20 years.
