Report from the First Scots Organ Commission

In late 2022, the Session established an Organ Commission to assess the state of the sanctuary's pipe organ and recommend necessary repairs and renovations. The commission aimed to ensure the organ's reliability ahead of the church's 300-year celebration in 2031. The organ last underwent significant renovation in 1992, focusing on repairs rather than a complete rebuild. Despite the organ's excellent tonal quality, several mechanical issues need addressing, including unreliable stop mechanisms, electrical control issues, and structural concerns in the organ chamber.

The Organ Commission, consisting of Darlene Daehler-Wilking, Bob Dawson (Chair), and others, ruled out a total replacement due to the high cost (\$2.5 to \$3 million) and dismissed the option of a digital organ replacement due to tonal and historical considerations. Instead, they pursued refurbishments to extend the organ's life and functionality, focusing on essential repairs to the console, electrical systems, and structural elements within the organ chamber.

R.A. Colby Company of Johnson City, TN, a firm with a history of maintaining the church's organ, has been chosen to conduct the refurbishments. The proposed scope includes replacing the balcony console, introducing a digital system for the electrical controls, and installing fiber optic cabling. The commission also plans to clean and refurbish pipes and other components, alongside necessary structural repairs within the organ chamber, such as addressing plaster decay. These renovations, costing approximately \$800,000, are scheduled for Summer 2025 and are expected to last over 20 years, ensuring the organ's continued role in worship and its historical significance to the sanctuary. The finance committee will oversee the fundraising efforts to support this project.
