

Today's postlude, "Fugue in E-flat Major" by Johann Sebastian Bach, comes from a collection of pieces by Bach known as Clavier-Übung III (Keyboard Practice III). Published in 1739, Clavier-Übung III is a collection of organ pieces that include chorale or hymn tune preludes that follow the format of the Lutheran Mass. The monumental "Prelude in E-flat Major" is the opening piece in this collection while the "Fugue in E-flat Major" is the closing piece. There are four collections by Bach entitled Clavier-Übung with Part III being written for the organ. The other three parts are written for the harpsichord.

There are several musical references to the Trinity in the Fugue in E-flat Major. The piece is in three sections making it a "triple fugue" which is three different fugues combined into one piece. It is also in the key of E-flat major whose key signature is three flats. Many believe Bach intended each of the three fugues to represent the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The number of measures in each fugue is divisible by three (1st and 3rd fugues are thirty-six measures, the second fugue is forty-five measures). Additionally, the piece was completed in September of 1739 or 09/39. Both numbers are divisible by three.

Organists have nicknamed the fugue "St. Anne Fugue" as the subject or main melody of the first fugue resembles the opening part of the hymn tune, "St. Anne." "St. Anne" is the tune that the hymn "O God, Our Help in Ages Past" is commonly sung. Although this tune was written in the early 1700s in England, it is likely that Bach did not know this hymn tune.
