Parramore Preaching Series




Today, we have the honor of hosting Dr. Jonathan Lee Walton for our Parramore Preaching Series. Dr. Walton is preaching today during both the 8:45 & 11:15 a.m. services and will give a talk for First (Scots) youth later this evening. We will also host a Leader's Luncheon on Monday, September 30, where Dr. Walton will be giving a talk.

Jonathan Lee Walton, Ph.D., is a social ethicist and religious educator known for engaging American evangelical traditions. On January 1, 2023, he became the 8th president of Princeton Theological Seminary.

He is the author of two books: Watch This! The Ethics and Aesthetics of Black Televangelism (NYU Press) and A Lens of Love: Reading the Bible in Its World for Our World (Westminster John Knox Press). Walton has also published dozens of works in various academic journals, books, magazines, and newspapers. His work and insights have been featured in national and international outlets, including the New York Times, CNN, Time Magazine, and the BBC.

Prior to becoming the president of Princeton Seminary, he served as the Plummer Professor of Christian Morals and Pusey Minister in the Memorial Church of Harvard University and dean of the School of Divinity and Wait Chapel at Wake Forest University. He earned his Ph.D. and Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary and his BA from Morehouse College in Atlanta.

Dr. Walton is married to Cecily Cline Walton, a children's book author. They are the parents of three children and reside in Princeton, NJ.






