### Middle School Youth: Paddleboarding

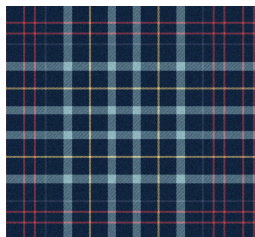
