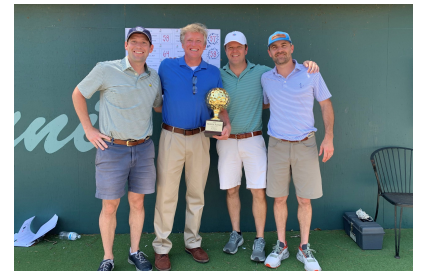

21st Annual Golf Tournament

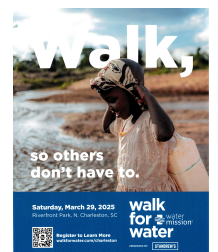
Monday, April 21st is First (Scots)' 21st Annual Golf Tournament at the Charleston Municipal Golf Course at 2110 Maybank Highway.

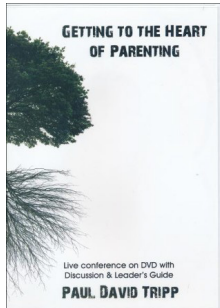

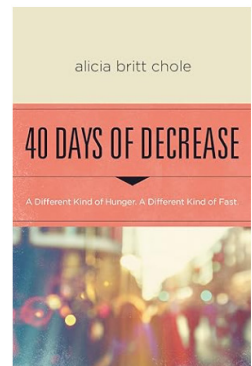
Wednesday Morning Bible Study
