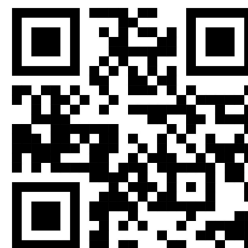


Calling all Women of First (Goats)!

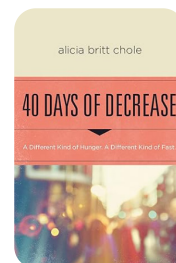
Co-Ed Table Talk Bible Study

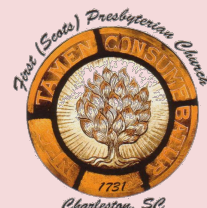

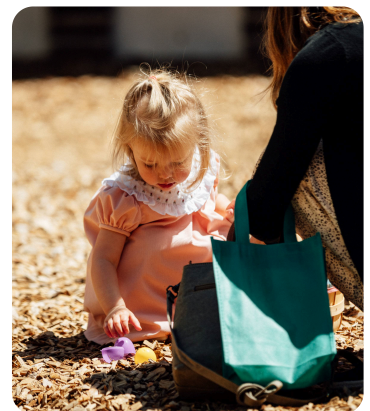
